The 3rd quarter of 2011 will not be remembered for good performance. Value underperformed and so did Europe compared to the US. We know from previous business cycles that Value as an investment style underperforms as the market prices in a recession. This time was no different. And Europe, because of the European debt crisis, underperformed at the same time. This was a double whammy for Sparinvest High Yield Value Bonds in terms of relative performance.

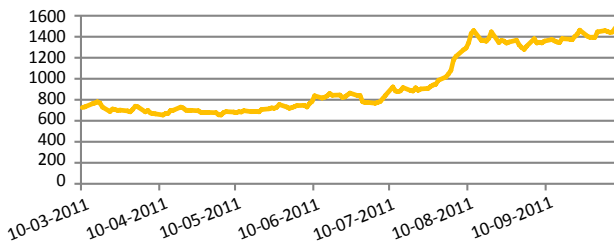

But wait a minute! – The performance of the underlying businesses was actually very strong. Indeed most of our companies have never been in better shape. Take the Energy sector as an example – the price of Brent oil has constantly been above 100\$ a barrel thus the oil sector has generated high income. Drilling companies have been able to charge higher day-rates and oil companies have been able to sell the the oil considerably higher than the cost price. The companies behind our two largest E&P positions have either divested assets or made significant new discoveries thereby increasing the liquidity of the assets. The largest position in Sparinvest High Yield Value Bonds, Ecobat, has had an excellent first half of the year and retains a solid outlook, yet has seen its bond drop 25% in price to yield more than 20% today. To witness such indiscriminate selling of quality bonds is difficult, but, as Value investors, it is our duty to think long term and stay focused on fundamentals and not fall victim to fear and panic. We believe that Sparinvest High Yield Value Bonds offers excellent value for the future both in absolute terms and relative to the market.

### Examples of dislocation and 'value'

Edcon is one of the leading retailers in South Africa. The credit premium on the Edcon 9.5% bond maturing in 2018 has risen from 7% over the risk-free rate in May this year to more than 14% today. Edcon's operating performance has not been bad – on the contrary. Revenues and margins have improved compared to last year and the South African economy seems to be performing quite well. That the South African economy is performing OK is reflected in the development of the national stock index TOP40 which is down around 4% in the same period. This does not make sense! – The Edcon 9.5% 2018 bond should not drop from a cash price of 95 to 75 at the same time as the general stock market drops by only 4%. Too much gloom and default risk has been priced into this bond. The gloom cannot be explained by direct links to Europe, since Edcon operates only in South Africa. Indirectly, though, Europe has the answer to the mispricing – Edcon is traded by the European High Yield desks at the big banks in London. And these trading desks have contributed greatly to the panic this summer.

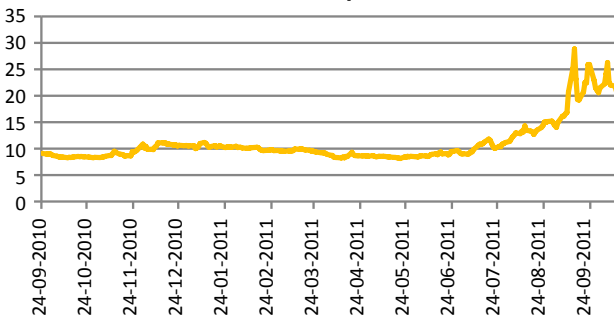
Credit premium on Edcon 9.5% 2018 (bp)



#### Intesa Sanpaolo SpA

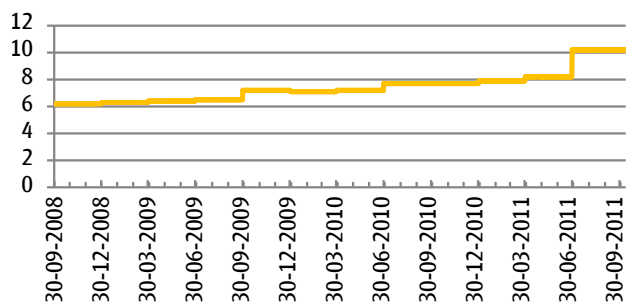
Another example of 'too much gloom in the price' is the 9.5% Intesa Sanpaolo bond. This bond has dropped from a price of 105 in June to 65 today. Intesa Sanpaolo is one of two large banks in Italy. Intesa has not experienced the boom/bust evolution of other large banks, it is been run consistently and conservatively for many years.

Yield on Intesa Sanpaolo 9,5% (%)

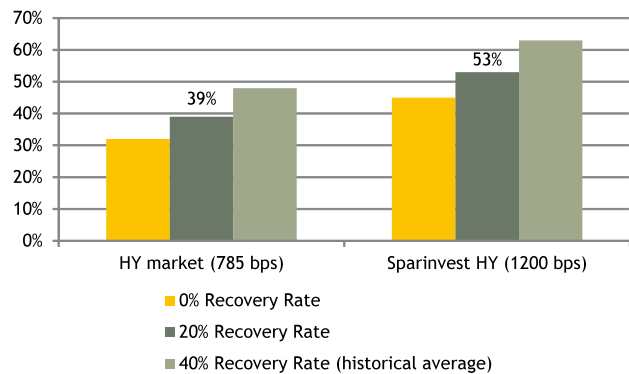


In line with this conservative approach to its business, Intesa performed a rights issue back in the early summer to bring its Core Tier 1 Capital Ratio to 10% – this is the highest it has ever been. Intesa does not have exposure to Greek Government bonds nor Portuguese. But Intesa does have exposure to Italian Government bonds. We see no problem with this. Italy is not Greece. Italy was already running a surplus on its primary balance before implementing new austerity measures. Italy is suffering from a lack of confidence – a situation that could easily be improved by a change of Premiership – something that may not be too distant on the horizon.

### What is in the price



One way of looking at whether a portfolio is cheap or not is to look at the number of defaults being implicitly discounted by the average credit premium or spread on the portfolio. Based on the benchmark portfolio where the current credit premium is 785 basis points (= 7.85%), 39% of the benchmark portfolio is expected to default, with an average recovery rate of 20% during the remaining lifetime of the current benchmark portfolio – adopting a buy-and-hold assumption. This is a very bearish expectation and this scenario of the future has no historical precedent. For our fund, expectations are even more bearish; using again a 20% recovery rate estimate, 53% of our fund is now expected to default.

This will not happen since our companies have very low financial gearing. And should we have a default, there is a high likelihood we will get closer to 40% in recovery rate on average because of lower Loan-to-Value among our companies. Using a 40% expected recovery rate for our fund implies an expectation then of 63% of the fund would default within the next 5 years – assuming a buy-and-hold approach. This is a much, much too bearish view on the underlying state of our businesses and the world in general.

## Key figures

The fund has cheapened a lot lately. The yield on the fund today is 14.6% compared to 9.4% for the benchmark. This is the largest difference in yield between the fund and the benchmark we have ever seen. Duration for the fund is 4.4 years, marginally higher than for the benchmark. The average credit rating is BB- for the fund compared to B+ for the broad market. The reason for this is an overweight of financials in our fund.

Our Market cap, on average, is higher than that of the broad market which is again related to our exposure to large European financials. Regarding financial gearing, net-debt-to-equity for our fund is 72.63%, on average compared to almost 300% for the broad market. Finally, we would like to stress that our fund consists of some very cheap companies – many of which are obvious takeover targets. The fund is constructed in such a way that this would be a beneficial rather than detrimental development.

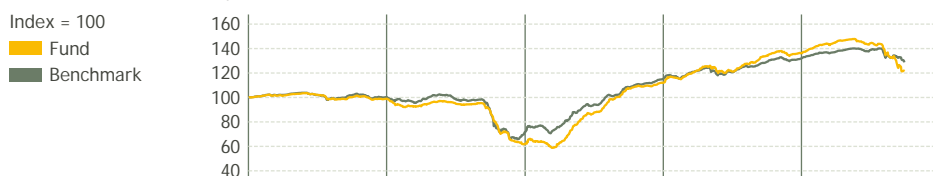

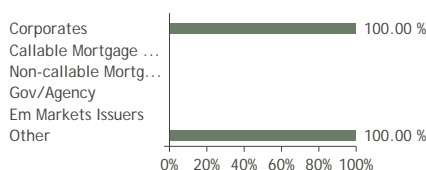

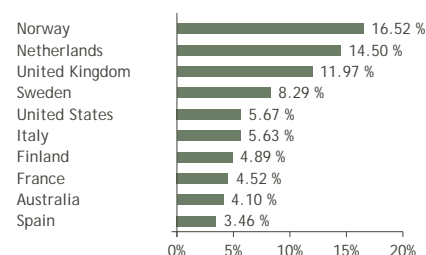
